Harlem Heights Cultural Arts & Community Center "We Are Ready to Roll!"

The **Heights Foundation** held a "We Are Ready to Roll" event to kick-off re-starting construction of the long -awaited Cultural Arts & Community Center. Located in Harlem Heights, the 14,000 sf Community Center will offer a variety of programs and services to the neighborhood, including creative and performing arts programs, computer classes, and senior center. Construction is to resume the first week of July, with an estimated completion date of November 2012. The Cultural Arts & Community Center was designed by **GMA Architects & Planners**, engineered by **TDM Consulting**, and constructed by **Owen-Ames-Kimball**.



C & D Recycling Increases Sustainability



Two local recycling facilities have applied to FDEP to add Transfer Station and Material Recovery Facility to their existing facilities. Once permitting is approved, **USA Mulch** in Lee County and **Yahl Mulching & Recycling** in Collier County will be able to provide facilities to recycle Construction & Demolition debris. According to FDEP, construction & demolition debris accounts for 25% of Florida's municipal solid waste. The **USGBC** awards LEED points for developments utilizing C & D recycling, counting it as a significant commitment to sustainable building. Coconut Cove 1 of 8 to receive LEED Platinum Certification


The U.S. Green Building Council (USGBC) awarded Coconut Cove in Cape Coral LEED Platinum Certification. The multi-family development is one of eight affordable housing projects to receive the honor. The LEED for Homes program is moving the residential market towards providing homes that are high-performing, healthy, and energy and cost efficient for the residents. Over half the LEED certified homes are in the affordable housing category. Coconut Cove was developed by The Southwest Florida Affordable Housing Choice Foundation, designed by Moore & Spence Architects, engineered by TDM Consulting, and constructed by Owen-Ames-Kimball.



Water Management on Barrier Islands presented by S.A.R.R.


